ACTIVITIES DONE IN NOVEMBER, 2020

LISTENING AND READING ACTIVITIES:

Students listened to the Jazz music of Louis Armstrong and B. B. King. They were informed about the historical aspect of the Jazz music and how it originated from the black race. Students were explained the reason of repeated lyrics and tone of the music. Kids showed a keen interest on exploring new vistas of Jazz music.

Reading session for the play ‘Mother’s Day’ was conducted in the class and simultaneously textual analysis was done. Students were told about the Irish and Cockney, London accents. Kids performed very well as per the given directions.

It was an enlightening quiz for kids as they got to know about different accents, and how to intone one’s speech with the help of stresses given in the transcriptions.



CHILDREN'S DAY AND DIWALI CELEBRATIONS ASSEMBLY

Nehru House had put in a lot of efforts making creative videos on various aspects of Nehruian Philosophy. It was shown to the kids and some foregrounding policies like compulsory primary education and provision of basic nutrients to eradicate malnutrition amongst kids started by Chacha Nehru, were discussed with the kids. Students were narrated the brief biography of Mr. Nehru. Kids were wished a happy and prospering Diwali and advised to spend a cracker-free Diwali. They were requested to stay indoors and avoid usual festive gatherings. Students participated energetically in the program and gave a positive response to the video shown to them.



ACTIVITY ON INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST VOILENCE AND BULLYING

- What is cyberbullying and face-to-face bullying? How can one prevent from getting in this trap? How to complain against it and be vigilant about it? These questions were discussed with students in the orientation held.
- Cyberbullying is bullying with the use of digital technologies. It can take place on social media, messaging platforms, gaming platforms and mobile phones. It is repeated behavior aimed at scaring, angering, or shaming those who are targeted.
- Face to face bullying and cyberbullying can often happen alongside each other. But cyberbullying leaves a digital footprint- a record that can prove useful and provide evidence to help stop the abuse.
- Were told how to complaint against it and briefed about the UNESCO and UNICEF websites dealing with it.
- Two videos from UNICEF websites were shown to the kids which they responded with immense enthusiasms.




ACTIVITY ON THE PREPARATION OF BANK RECONCILIATION STATEMENT
