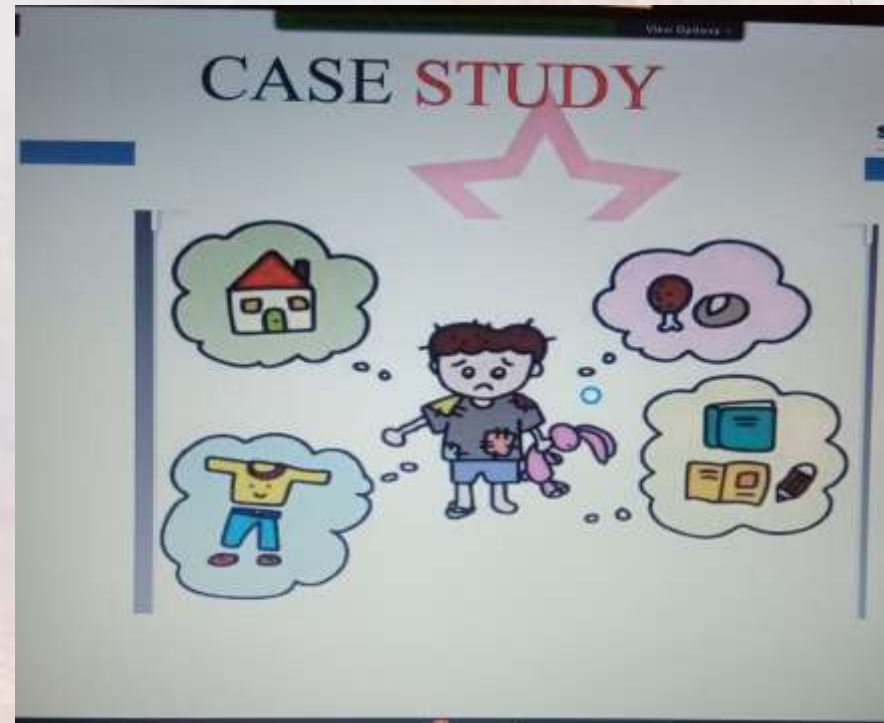
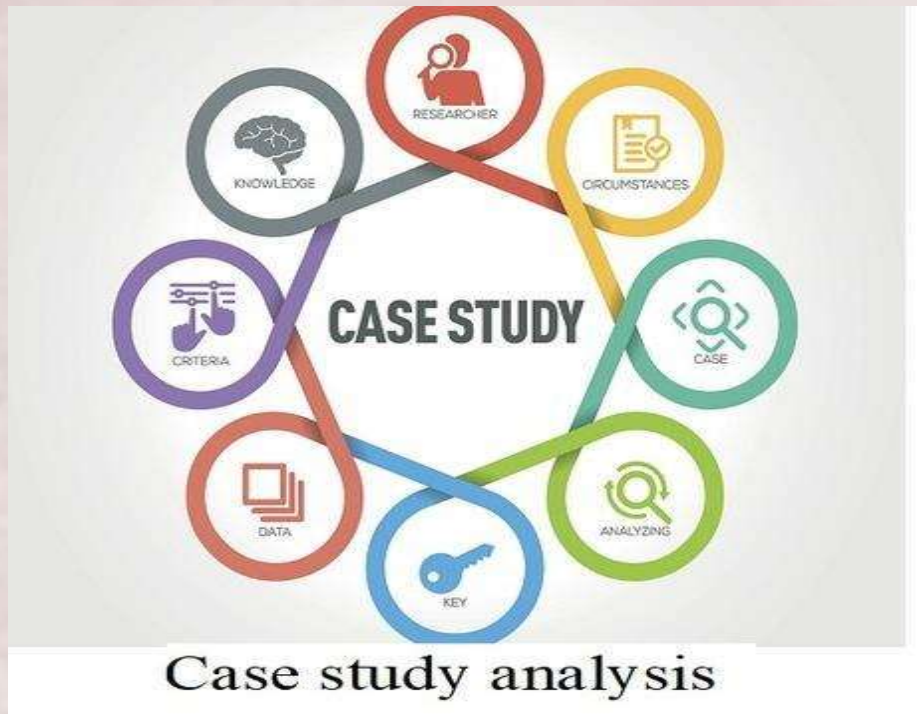
# CREATIVE WRITING ACTIVITY:

## Statistical questions Activity:

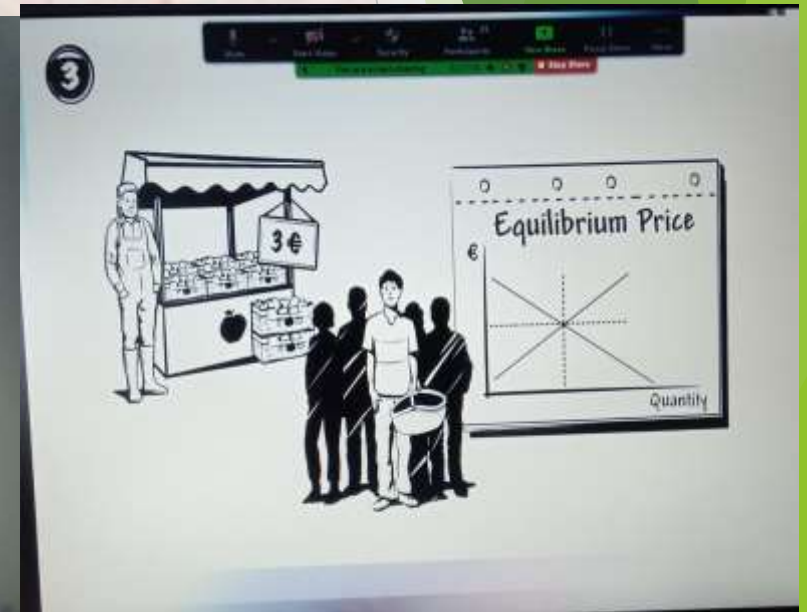
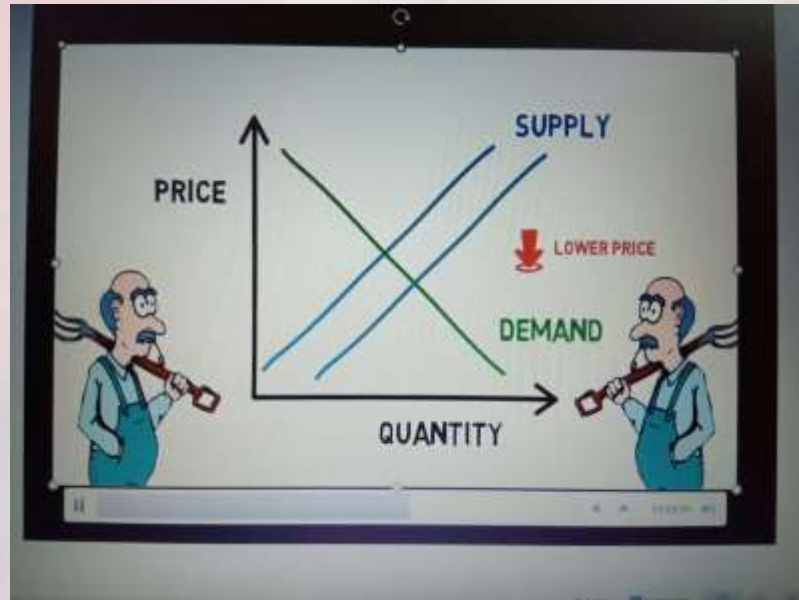
